This year we are celebrating the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the American Tree Farm System (ATFS) and the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the NJ Tree Farm Program (NJTFP). Another outstanding day is planned for you all at the Diocese of Camden property in the Pine Barrens. A lot of activity has occurred over the past 20+ years on this 900 acre Tree Farm. Some of the activities planned to visit include prescribed burning sites, reforestation sites both planted and naturally occurring, and firewood thinning. The terrain is flat but we will be walking through areas of the woods with no trails so we will give it a moderate difficulty walking rating. We will have some vans available to get folks to the sites we will be visiting that are furthest away.

We will have our traditional presentation of awards to the Outstanding Tree Farmer of the Year (OTFY) and the George Pierson Forest Steward of the Year during the lunch break; Tree ID contest with prizes for winner, raffle of Stihl product, and the "silent auction". Come share with us in celebrating 70 years of tree farming in New Jersey and congratulating your peers for their outstanding achievements in forest resource management.

We encourage you to mark Friday June 3rd 2016 on your calendar and come out and see some more truly outstanding forest resource management and at the same time support your NJ Tree Farm Program.
